

Workshop and Training on ‘Peer-Learning of UT Officials of Dadra and Nagar Haveli and Daman and Diu on Land Record Modernization’

The Department of Land Resources (DoLR), Ministry of Rural Development (MoRD) initiated series of workshop cum training programmes to be undertaken by the B N Yugandhar Centre for Rural Studies (BNY-CRS) for supporting the Implementation of DILRMP. 17 states have been identified for conducting peer learning workshop and training programme for the revenue officials. In this context, a one-day Workshop and Training programme on ‘Peer-Learning of UT Officials of Dadra and Nagar Haveli and Daman and Diu on Land Record Modernization’ was held on 13th February 2025 at Daman. The workshop commenced with the registration of participants, followed by a welcome address delivered by Shri Snehasis Mishra, Assistant Professor, BNYCRS in the presence of Shri Priyanshu Singh DANICS, Deputy Collector (HQ) cum SDM, Daman.



The technical sessions began with a presentation on “Geo-referencing of Cadastral Maps”, led by **Dr. Sanjay Patil**, Resource Scientist and Head, Maharashtra Remote Sensing Application Centre (MRSAC), Pune, along Shri Ajay Bhunge, Office Superintendent and Shri Tushar Shelar, Team Lead, GIS Cell from the Office of the Settlement Commissioner, Maharashtra. The session addressed key methodologies, implementation strategies, and practical challenges in geo-referencing.

The second technical session focused on “Cyber Tehsil 2.0 – Single Online Portal for Land Administration”, showcasing the transformative digital solutions implemented in Madhya Pradesh. The session featured insights from Shri Amit Kumar Mishra, Shri Surendra Singh Dangi, Senior Consultants and Smt. Oshin Victor, In-charge Tehsildar, who shared best practices, integration models, and citizen interface mechanisms.

The final technical session on “Survey/Resurvey using Modern Technology – Challenges and Solutions” was conducted by Dr. Lakshmi Kantakumar Neelamsetti and Shri Umakant G. Banadagar, both Officer Surveyors, who presented modern survey techniques and addressed the practical field-level issues encountered during resurveys.
